Floris Gillyard-Lymore standing in J Gillyard Treasures

This edition of Family Matters shines the spotlight on Floris Gillyard-Lymore and J Gillyard Treasures. In January 1991, in her home, Floris started an

Afrocentric gift shop business. She wanted to create a shop to offer afrocentric gifts and home décor in North County, a suburb of St. Louis, Missouri. At the time there were no businesses offering items that represented the African American community in the area. She named the shop "J Gillyard Treasures" to give honor to her mother and father. The letter J stands for her mother's maiden name, James and Gillyard, for her father's name. She stated "I put the two names together and added treasures because they were both treasures in my life and if it had not been for the two of them, I would not be here today. "

During the first two years of the business, Floris did festivals, conventions, craft shows and flea market malls, locally and within a 500 miles radius of her home.

Though she didn't have a store front, the business grew and customers made contact with her to purchase Afrocentric cards, gifts

### Healthy Living Managing Arthritis Pain

Arthritis means ongoing joint aches, stiffness, or swelling that cause chronic pain. Whatever type of arthritis you have, there are some things you can do to help ease the pain.

Get gentle exercise. Stretching, musclestrengthening, walking, and aerobic activity can all help relieve arthritis pain. Go slowly at first and rest when you need to. Exercises that are gentle on joints include bicycling, swimming or water walking, yoga, tai chi, and qi gong.

Manage your weight. Being overweight puts extra strain on weight-bearing joints (like hips and knees). Get tips for reaching a healthy weight.

Pick up a new tool. Velcro, grips, walking poles, canes, and other tools or "assistive devices" can help you with daily tasks. Learn about assistive devices and tips for getting around your home and office that make movement easier.

Use ice and heat. Heat works best for soreness and stiffness — try a heating pad, hot shower, or hot pack 2 or 3 times a day for 20 to 30 minutes. Cold works best for swollen joints — try putting cold packs on a painful joint 2 or 3 times a day for 10 to 20 minutes. Be sure to put a thin towel between the ice and your skin.

Eat more fish. Fish oil contains omega-3 fatty acids. Some people believe that these fatty acids may help with joint inflammation in some forms of arthritis. Learn about the benefits of fish.

Talk to your doctor about alternative therapy and treatments and pain medications for arthritis.
